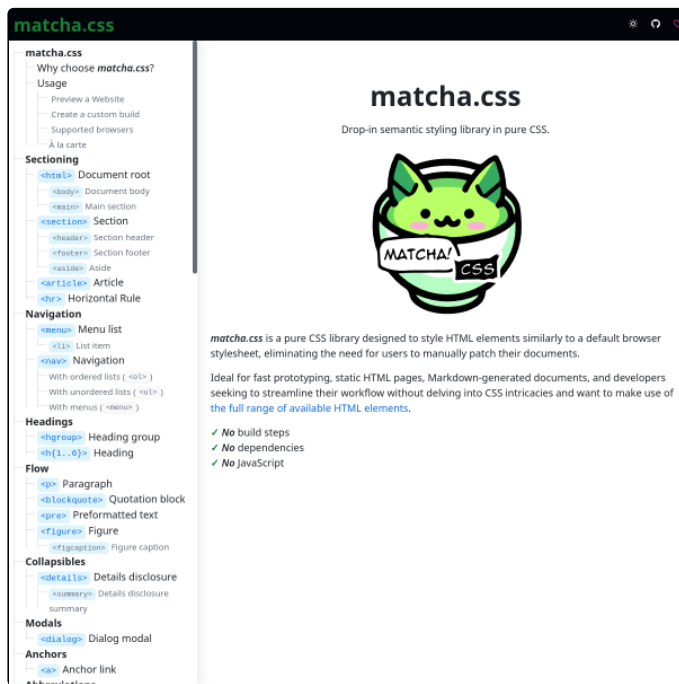

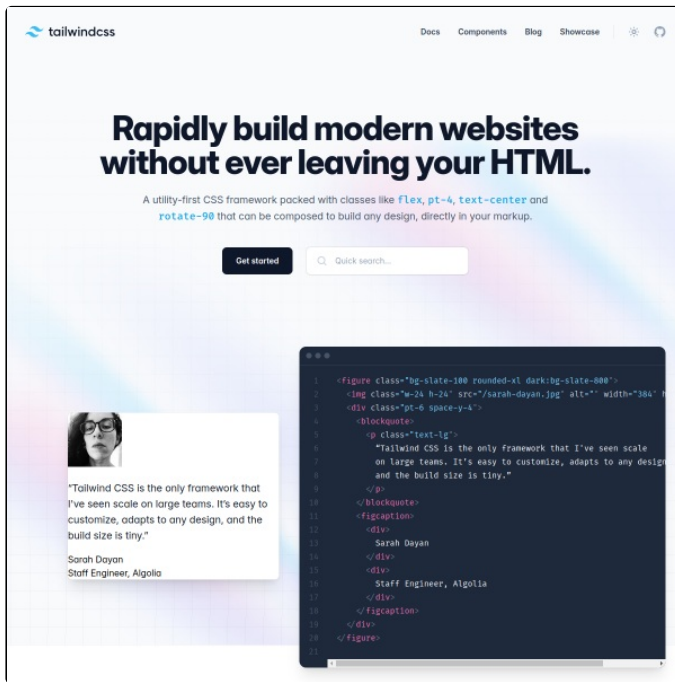

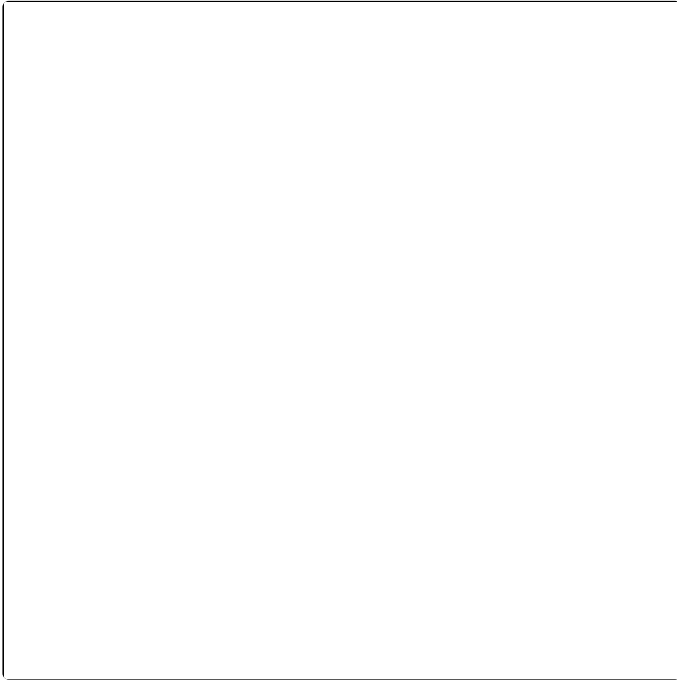
Tailwind.css – my favorite

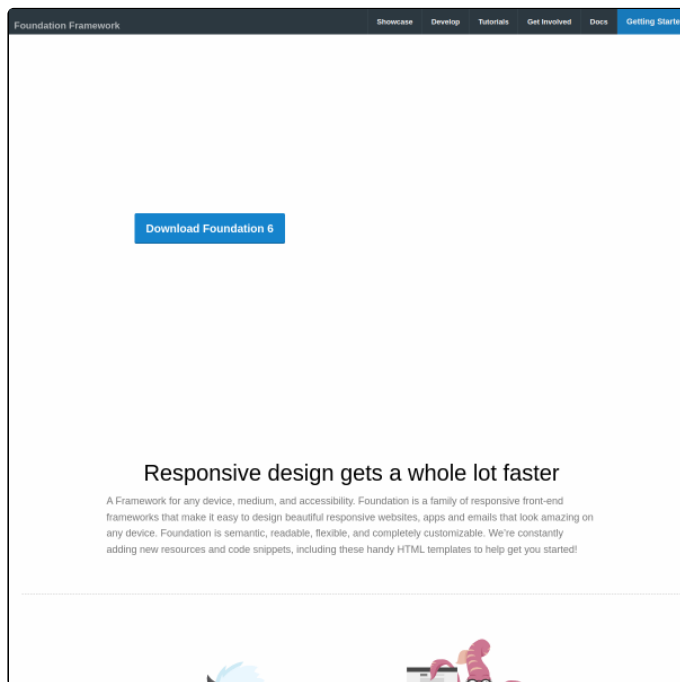
Bootstrap.css - the fallback for admin UI
